#### March 4 -

Fr. Bob Amundsen conducted our Mini Lenten Retreat. He was at Immaculate Conception for 18 years. He says many people are missing the mark on sin and grace. Our individualism [in the USA] has our consciences focused on private sins rather than communal sins. He encourages us to reflect on the traditional works of mercy during our examination of conscience.

#### March 18 -

Deacon Steve Vallero attended via zoom. At present, he is Continuing Formation for Clergy Director at the Pastoral Center, coordinating the formation of both priests and deacons, and on weekends he teaches at the seminary and serves at Nativity.

In his youth he wanted to be a Franciscan because he admired to St. Francis. He liked to be an altar server because he got out of school on occasion.

He met Deacon Pat Bradley at Nativity, and then in 1995 started deacon formation studies with the class of 2001. The class started with a priest director, then got a deacon director, Deacon Al Sandoval. Then the program changed from five to four years, and they were ordained on June 10, 2000. He was assigned a parish and a large prison ministry.

He encourages us to pray for prisoners. "97% of incarcerated people eventually become our neighbors."
