What is "Deacon Sunday"?

Deacon Sunday is a special day set aside to honor the diaconate. It is a day to affirm these men who have said YES to serving the Church in a profound way. Deacons are fully ordained clergy, reporting directly to the bishop.

What do deacons do?

- Proclaim the Gospel
- Baptize
- Witness marriages
- Perform funeral and burial services outside of the Eucharist
- Distribute Holy Communion
- Preach the homily
- Visit the sick
- Teach the faith
- Provide counsel for couples and individuals
- Work on parish committees
- Advise and assist pastors

How can I honor my deacon?

- Pray for your deacon, and all deacons serving in the Archdiocese and elsewhere
- Pray for the vocation programs for the Archdiocese and for more people to be open to a call to the diaconate, priesthood, and religious brothers and sisters
- Personally thank your deacon on Deacon Sunday, or any day
- Invite children in Religious Education or school classes to write or draw notes of appreciation
- Invite your deacon for dinner with your family and friends
- Hold a reception for your deacons and their wives to say thank you for their service to the parish
- Send a card or letter to a retired deacon
